WHAT'S NEW

New Striped Bass Limits

On May 2, 2023, the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) Striped Bass Board (Board) voted to take emergency action to support stock rebuilding by implementing a 1 fish @ 28" to 31" size slot limit on the recreational striped bass fishery coastwide. On June 20, 2023, the NJ Marine Fisheries Council (MFC) voted to implement the new slot to stay in-compliance with ASFMC.

- The new striped bass regulations will be effective on July 2, 2023, as follows:
 - 1 fish @ 28" to 31" in all state waters
- Atlantic Ocean, 0 to 3 miles from shore, no closed season
- All other marine waters, open Mar. 1 to Dec. 31
- Delaware River and tributaries from Calhoun St. Bridge, Trenton to Salem River and tributaries are closed from April 1 until May 31

The emergency action will not affect the <u>Striped Bass Bonus Program (SBBP)</u>. The SBBP regulations will remain:

- 1 fish @ 24" to less than 28"
- Open season: May 15 to December 31

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Funds to Advance Sustainable Technologies Now Available to New Jersey Shellfish Producers

Funding is now available to New Jersey shellfish aquaculture producers to implement conservation practices that promote aquatic habitat on shellfish leases and enhance water quality through the NJ COASTAL Project, a Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) agreement between the Ocean County Soil Conservation District (OCSCD) and the USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). The target area for this project is the state's coastal bays, with a focus on Barnegat Bay and the Great Bay region. While NRCS accepts applications year-round, New Jersey producers should apply by July 15, 2023 to be considered for funding.

<u>Deer Fencing Grants for Unpreserved Farms.</u> Unpreserved farm owners or operators in New Jersey may receive up to 50 percent matching funds (\$20,000 maximum, no more than \$200 per acre) from NJDA.

Organic Certification Cost Share Program (OCCSP). Certified operations may receive up to 75 percent of their certification costs paid during the program year, not to exceed \$750 per certification scope.

Soil Health Academy Scholarship. Scholarships are available to attend one of their 3-day event. Apply here.

<u>Farm and Ranch Stress Assistance Network (FRSAN)</u>. The long-term goal of the FRSAN projects is to establish a Farm and Ranch Stress Assistance Network that provides stress assistance programs to individuals who are engaged in farming, ranching, and other agriculture-related occupations on a regional basis.

Regional Conservation Partnership Program. \$500 million in funding to advance partner-driven solutions to conservation on agricultural land. Application deadline: August 18, 2023
