FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Organic Farming Research Foundation Farmer-Led Trials Program – ATTRA: Organic Farming Research Foundation Farmer-Led Trials Program November 2, 2023/in Funding Applications will be accepted through December 3, 2023.

Organic Farming Research Foundation's new Farmer-Led Trials program provides farmers with funding and technical assistance to investigate and learn about solutions to their most pressing production challenges. This program will provide support for on-farm learning trials aimed at testing new practices, inputs, varieties, or animal breeds that can improve profitability and environmental sustainability, leading to more resilient organic farms and ranches. Farmers or ranchers in the United States or its territories on certified organic or transitioning to organic land are eligible to apply. Priority will be given to Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC), veteran, and beginning farmers.

FACT Fund-a-Farmer Grants – ATTRA: Applications are due January 15, 2024. Food Animal Concerns Trust (FACT) awards competitive grants of up to \$3,000 to working, independent farmers located in the 50 United States and five major U.S. territories who raise beef cattle, bison, broiler chickens, dairy cows, ducks, geese, goats, laying hens, pigs, sheep and/or turkeys. Grants are offered for farmers to improve or expand pasture for their animals, for farmers who are pursuing animal welfare certification, and for welfare-certified farmers to build capacity or maintain certification.

<u>Forest Landowner Support</u> provides financial assistance for underserved and small-acreage forest landowners to participate in emerging private markets for climate mitigation and forest resilience. *Application deadline*: Oct. 21, 2023.

SNAP Online Grant MarketLink is offering a grant to help direct-marketing farmers accept SNAP benefits online. The grant will cover all SNAP online transactions through GrownBy and WorldPay during the first year, as well as technical assistance with the USDA SNAP retailer authorization, training support, and ongoing maintenance.

Organic Certification Cost Share Program (OCCSP). Certified operations may receive up to 75 percent of their certification costs paid during the program year, not to exceed \$750 per certification scope.

Soil Health Academy Scholarship. Scholarships are available to attend one of their 3-day event. Apply here.

Farm and Ranch Stress Assistance Network (FRSAN). The long-term goal of the FRSAN projects is to establish a Farm and Ranch Stress Assistance Network that provides stress assistance programs to individuals who are engaged in farming, ranching, and other agriculture-related occupations on a regional basis.

<u>Safeguard NJ Wetlands</u> The Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (ACEP) helps landowners, land trusts, and other entities protect, restore, and enhance wetlands or protect working farms and ranches through conservation easements.

High Tunnel Initiative | Natural Resources Conservation Service | High Tunnels are designed to help producers extend the growing season, increase productivity, keep plants at a steady temperature, and conserve water and energy. The EQIP high tunnel signup will be administered through the ACT NOW approach, which is a targeted, rapid, and streamlined application and contract approval process. While NRCS accepts applications year-round, NRCS-NJ has established an evaluation period cut-off date for ACT NOW funding of January 26, 2024. Applications through ACT NOW funding will be selected if the minimum threshold ranking score is met. Applications submitted prior to the cut-off will be assessed and ranked as soon as they are received.
