FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

New Jersey Conservation Stewardship Program NRCS Whether you are looking to improve grazing conditions, increase crop resiliency, or develop wildlife habitat, we can custom design a CSP plan to help you meet those goals.

America the Beautiful Challenge 2024 Pre-proposals are due by April 4, 2024.

The America the Beautiful Challenge streamlines grant funding opportunities for new voluntary conservation and restoration projects throughout the United States. This RFP consolidates funding from multiple federal agencies and the private sector to enable applicants to conceive and develop large-scale, locally led projects that address shared funder priorities spanning public, Tribal, and private lands.

Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program Applications are due April 4, 2024.

The National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) is accepting applications for \$24 million in funding through the Beginning Farmer and Rancher Development Program. This program supports the delivery of education, outreach, and technical assistance for beginning farmers and ranchers in the United States and its territories that are entering, establishing, building, and managing successful farm and ranch enterprises. The maximum grant is \$250,000 per year for three years.

<u>Urban & Community Forestry 2024 Challenge Cost Share Grant Program</u>. Application deadline: Feb. 29, 2024. <u>EPA's Community Change Grants Program</u> has announced \$2 billion dollars in Inflation Reduction Act funds for environmental and climate justice activities. Application deadline: Nov. 21, 2024.

Rural Energy for America Program Renewable Energy Systems & Energy Efficiency Improvement Guaranteed Loans & Grants fund renewable energy systems or to make energy efficiency improvements for agricultural producers and rural small businesses. Multiple deadlines.

<u>USDA Value-Added Producers Grant</u> The Value-Added Producer Grant program helps agricultural producers enter value-added activities to generate new products, create and expand marketing opportunities, and increase producer income.

Amber Grant for Women

WomensNet launched the Amber Grant in 1998 to honor the memory of an ambitious young woman who died at the age of 19, before she could realize her entrepreneurial aspirations. Every month, WomensNet awards one or more Amber Grants of \$10,000 each. Then, at the end of the year, one of those grant recipients is selected to receive \$25,000!

Farm Business Mgmt. & Benchmarking Program

The Farm Business Management and Benchmarking Competitive Grants Program provides funds for improving farm management knowledge and skills of agricultural producers by maintaining and expanding a national, publicly-available farm financial management database to support improved farm management.

Black Farmer Fund Rapid Response Program

This fund seeks to address acute emergencies to provide immediate restoration of an operation—not recurring expenses, rental assistance or start-up costs. Eligible emergency situations include but are not limited to equipment breakdown, weather, loss of crops / animals, medical expenses, stolen or damaged supplies, etc.

Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program

The primary goal and objective of the GusNIP Produce Prescription Program is to demonstrate and evaluate the impact of projects on the improvement of dietary health through increased consumption of fruits and vegetables, the reduction of individual and household food insecurity and the reduction in healthcare and associated costs.

Mid-late March is a great time to start some of your vegetable seeds indoors - just be sure to check the germination period to make sure you aren't starting too early! Peppers, eggplant, tomatoes, lettuces, can all be started indoors and transplanted into the garden. Peas can be directly sown outside. Later in the month, once the soil is warm enough, consider planting some cool-season crops such as radishes, carrots or cauliflower, which can be direct sown.
