FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

- <u>Healthy Food Financing Initiative-Food Access and Retail Expansion Fund</u>: \$9M available for implementation grants, \$1.5M for technical assistance and \$16M for Ioans. Proposals should contribute to food access through the availability of an assortment of Staple and Perishable Foods for retail sale, either directly or as part of the retail supply chain. Funding Inquiry Form deadline: March 3 for grants, Ioans and technical assistance are accepted on a rolling basis.
 <u>Northeast Dairy Business Innovation Dairy Co-Packing Grant</u>: Application is open until April 10 at 2pm. This grant supports existing licensed dairy processors and dairy brands in the Northeast engaged in or planning to use co-packing arrangements. Grants will range from \$15,000 to
 - \$150,000 with a 25% cash and/or in-kind match contribution.

Time to prune!

February and March are a great time to prune your shrubs. Renewal pruning of shrubs will encourage new growth from the base of the shrub, by removing the oldest growth and any dead material, opening the center of the shrub to let in more light and air.


