GARDENING TIP By Jen Sawyer Caraballo

Finish up prepping your garden beds. Apply mulch where needed in your perennial beds and around shrubs/trees. You may need to start potting up or hardening off those seedlings you started indoors in March. Plant any cool season seedlings. Don't for get to watch the overnight temperatures! If you have transplants in the garden, they may need to have some overnight protection if the temperature is going to drop below 40. Deadhead your daffodils and let the leaves die back naturally – this allows the plant to store up food in the bulb for next year's blooms!

- Healthy Food Financing Initiative- Food Access and Retail Expansion Fund: Proposals should contribute to food access through the availability of an assortment of Staple and Perishable Foods for retail sale, either directly or as part of the retail supply chain. Funding Inquiry Form deadline: March 3 for grants, loans and technical assistance are accepted on a rolling basis.
- Food Safety Certification for Specialty Crops Program. Provides financial assistance for specialty crop operations that incur eligible on-farm food safety program expenses related to obtaining or renewing a food safety certification.
- <u>New Jersey Agricultural Conservation Easement Program</u>. On March 13, 2024, NRCS announced it will invest about \$138 million of financial assistance from the Inflation Reduction Act in 138 new conservation easements, through which farmers and ranchers are conserving wetlands, grasslands and prime farmlands.
