

Funding Opportunities

Amber Grants for Women: WomensNet funds several women business grants throughout the year — \$435,000 available. A single application can be submitted and be considered for all grants.

Food Animal Concerns Trust Grants: FACT awards scholarships of up to \$400 for livestock and poultry farmers to attend educational events – including virtual events – to learn knowledge, skills and best practices related to humane animal management, business and farm finance, and/or value-added production processes. Scholarships are for registration costs only.

<u>USDA Rural Cooperative Development Grants</u>: RCDG funding is used improve the economic condition of rural areas by helping nonprofit organizations to provide technical assistance to start, expand, or improve cooperatives and mutually owned businesses in rural areas.

Agriculture & Food Research Initiative: The goal of this program is to invest in agricultural production research, education, and extension projects for more sustainable, productive, and economically-viable plant and animal production systems.

The FruitGuys Community Fund Applications will start being accepted in December and into January 2026. These grants are up to \$5,000 for farm owners who have long-term land access and have operated for a minimum of two years.

<u>Farmers Grant from the For Farmers Movement</u> annually funds anything that strengthens a small farm—repairs, infrastructure, equipment, tools, projects, recovery, innovation, etc. This competitive award ranges between \$500 and \$1000. Applications will be accepted until October 31st and awards will be announced on December 3rd

Funding is available to help farmers implement the best management practices used to improve your animal waste management. Best management practices will be tailored to each farm but may include practices such as exclusionary fencing, filter strips, pasture management, etc.

AT NO COST TO YOU!

Who needs an Animal Waste Management Plan?

Animal Waste Management Plans are required by state law for any farms with more than 8 animal units (8,000lbs) of live animals. These plans lay out how manures will be handled to limit the environmental degradation they can cause.
