Funding Opportunities

New Jersey Agritourism Grant Program (NJATP): The purpose of the New Jersey Agritourism Grant Program is to provide funding to support New Jersey agritourism businesses in their efforts to attract, entertain, and educate visitors. Deadline: January 30, 2026

Food Animal Concerns Trust Grants: FACT awards scholarships of up to \$400 for livestock and poultry farmers to attend educational events to learn knowledge, skills and best practices related to humane animal management, business and farm finance, and/or value-added production processes.

<u>USDA Rural Cooperative Development Grants</u>:RCDG funding is used improve the economic condition of rural areas by helping nonprofit organizations to provide technical assistance to start, expand, or improve cooperatives and mutually owned businesses in rural areas.

Agriculture & Food Research Initiative: The goal of this program is to invest in agricultural production research, education, and extension projects for more sustainable, productive, and economically-viable plant and animal production systems.

The FruitGuys Community Fund Applications will start being accepted in December and into January 2026. These grants are up to \$5,000 for farm owners who have long-term land access and have operated for a minimum of two years.
